



Race/Ethnicity of Student Body





OUR SCHOLARS COMPARED TO PEERS


2019 MCAS Student Scores Across Grades 5-8 (% Proficient or Advanced)

General Student Body






5TH GRADE STUDENTS MAKE A LEAP AT VPCS


At the end of the year, VPCS had 18% more 5th graders on grade level in math and 13% more in ELA, closing the gap to the State. That's good enough to be #1 for growth in Massachusetts across all schools welcoming students as 5th grade middle schoolers.

8th graders were in the top 25% of students in the state in math and had the second highest growth out of all middle schools in the state.


MATH ACHIEVEMENT PERCENTILE

COMPARED TO STATE AND DISTRICT















JAYLA FISHER 8TH GRADER


